229 - 247 Regent Street

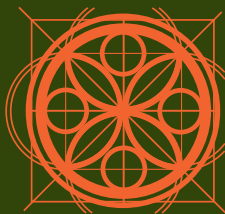
During the 19th century Regent Street became one of the most famous streets in Europe, attracting not only the English aristocracy and gentry but also wealthy cosmopolitan shoppers from the Continent. It was a splendid display case for luxury merchandise and had a reputation for being one of the most fashionable streets to be seen in.

The original buildings were pleasant to look at but, by the turn of the century, could not be adapted to meet modern requirements. The Crown Estate took the opportunity presented by the expiry of initial building leases and offered new 80 year lease terms to those tenants willing to rebuild.

The opportunity to redevelop the island site of 229-247 Regent Street completed another 80 year cycle in 2004 when Paye Stonework & Restoration cleaned and repaired the elevations as part of a major retained façade project.

These works included the dismantling and rebuilding of the sixth floor cupola and all of the chimney stacks and decorative urns.
