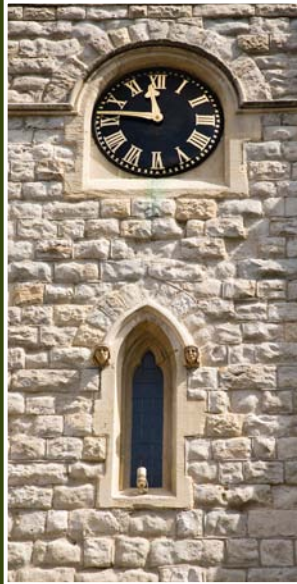
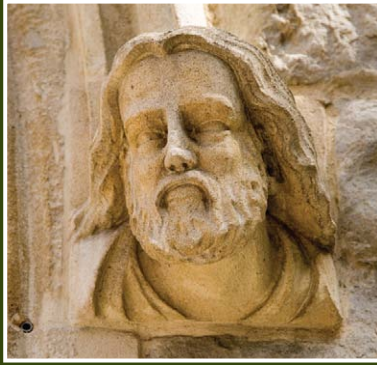

## The Armenian Church

Saint Yeghiche Armenian Church is the main and largest church of the Armenian Apostolic Church in Great Britain. The church was built as St Peter's Anglican Church between 1866 and 1873 and was closed c. 1973: the building was purchased by the Armenian Church in 1998 and restored from a state of considerable neglect.

The church was one of six grand churches built at the time using pitch faced ragstone to reflect their local status. Whilst the outside of the church was constructed using simple plain materials in the grand Gothic style the interior was awash with polychromatic brickwork.

PAYE's specialist masons and restorers were required to repair the neglected masonry facades, brickwork and stone flooring, including the indenting of the eroded tracery and hood moulds with new stone carved to match the original profile.

Our sculptors were commissioned to replace some the eroded hood mould stops using the generous benefactor and his family as models for the new pieces.
