Queens Chapel

On the corner of Pall Mall, a few metres down Marlborough Road is the pale yellow building of the Queen's Chapel - the first classical church in England. It's part of the Royal Palaces complex, but politically and socially separate.

It was designed by Inigo Jones in 1623 as a catholic chapel for various Queens imported from Europe: Henrietta Maria, Catherine of Braganza and Charlotte von Mecklenburgh.

PAYE Stonework were appointed to clean and repair the external facades using traditional lime based stucco mortars then applying a lime based stucco repair mortar. The works were completed by applying multiple layers of a lime wash which includes a cowsmilk extract.
