Reform Club

The Reform Club situated in the Pall Mall, was completed in 1841 to designs by Charles Barry.

Our specialists craftsmen were required for the works, which comprised of adapting two window openings into doorways spanning a lightwell using Portland Combe field Whitbed to match the original building, and constructing two flights of ornate stone steps to allow access to the Waterloo Gardens.

Safety platforms were erected and original balusters, plinth and copings were dismantled to allow for reuse. Where possible original stone and features were re-used to comply with English Heritage requirements. The steps had been designed to blend in with the remainder of the clubhouse, drawing on available motifs and mouldings.
