Inverforth House

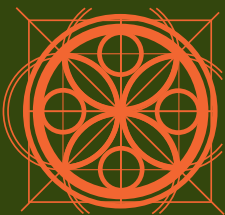
Reviving the Edwardian architectural splendour of the home and gardens constructed by a soap millionaire proved to be an exciting challenge for Paye Stonework as part of the conversion work being undertaken at Inverforth House, Hampstead Heath into luxurious apartments and homes.

Lord Leverhulme bought Inverforth house in 1904 when he moved his Port Sunlight headquarters to London. Using the same Architect T H Mawson a series of walks and staircases were constructed in the gardens.

The garden walks were conceived on a grand scale including a centre piece known as the Eagle Staircase which was described in 'Country and Life' as 'one of the happiest conceptions of the garden' and that 'nothing could be more graceful than the design of the horseshoe stair with curving balustrade and upper piers ornamented with eagles'

The balustrade more commonly known as a 'ramp and twist balustrade' is one of the most complex stone units to detail and the skill of the masons was required to ensure that the replica units installed fitted seamlessly.
